# 3. Technical requirement

Conformity requirements:	Compliance of goods to applicable standards shall be demonstrated with conformity documents issued by accredited entities, manufacturers' in-house laboratory and/or testing.  Applicable standards are: Mauritanian standards and technical regulations, and by default to international standards (ISO, IEC, Codex Alimentarius, UN ECE), or the manufacturer's specifications in the absence of applicable standards.
National deviations:	Law No. 2020-007 on consumer protection, fixing requirements on the labelling and presentation of foodstuffs.
	For foodstuffs, the following marking shall be mentioned:     Production date     Presence of allergens     For meat products: animal species.  Foodstuffs containing genetically modified organisms require special authorization from Ministry of trade, health and environment in order to be placed on the market, and must indicate on their labelling the presence of genetically modified organisms.
	The remaining shelf life for foodstuffs shall be <b>at least 50%</b> of the total shelf life at the time of importation.
Labelling requirements:	Language: - Markings and instructions required per the applicable standards for foodstuffs shall be at least in Arabic or in French
